
Activity 1. Find the sound (focus on initial sounds).

Play the game 'spot the sound' using the alphabet sound mat.

Say the sound and ask your child to repeat the sound after you. Next ask them to find the correct letter to represent that sound.



Activity 2.

Match the Word to the picture (focus on initial and ending sounds).

Say the name of the picture and find the matching word by looking for the initial sound.

Match the picture to the word and ask your child to say the ending sound.

When all the words and pictures are matched up, ask your child to identify the words that rhyme.

Activity 3. Make the C.V.C. word (consonant, vowel, consonant). Focus on blending sounds together.
